Sir,

The note of the 22nd current which I have had the honor to receive from your Department, enclosing Copies of the Decree of His Excellency the Liberator of the 30th of March last, and of that of Their Excellencies the Council of Government of the 4th of June last, I have communicated to the Chairman of the British Merchants.

I am still equally at a loss to conjecture, how the circulating Capital of each individual has been ascertained, and imagine that an average estimate of 20% on the amount of such Capital, (whatever it may be,) is a far higher ratio than the facts would
